518. "G. Sener, Cast Steel, Lancaster" left-hand "Goosewing" side smoothing axe w/ 13 3/4" edge. The axe has chamfer top tapered off-set socket, tapered butt-plate & fine "tombstone arch-top" key, G+-Vg. Attributed to Gottlieb Sener, circa 1843, Lancaster City.
519. "H. Mellinger" broad Kent-type felling/blocking axe, G. attributed to Henry Mellinger, mid-late 19th century, Washington Boro, Lancaster Co.

520. "J. Rees" Wheelwright's T-handled hooked-tip tapered hub auger, G-G+. Handle has later block mounted as spacer (possible early replacement handle??). Attributed to John Rees (Reese) working as early as 1788, in Strasburg Twp., Lancaster Co.
521. Branded "D.K. Young" three-prong wooden shaking fork, F-G (noted bug hole damage). Attributed to Daniel Koser Young (1853-1932) of Cocalico Twp., Lancaster. He was the one of a multi-generational of wooden fork & rake makers. He was the father of Milton B. Young, who is possible the most prolific maker.
522. "G. Miller" large left-hand side broad axe w/ 13" edge & dbl.-lugged center mount, carved off-set handle, G-G+. Attributed to George Miller working mid 19th century in Brecknock Twp., Berks Co.
523. Rare maker's mark, "P. Hofman" (embossed arch strike) early Pennsylvania right-hand "Buzzard-wing" side broad axe w/ extended poll & excellent modern oak carved off-set handle, G+. Axe is attributed to Philip Hoffman working as early as 1780, in Cocalico Twp., Lancaster Co.
524. Double-struck, Lancaster Co. 2 1/2" socket handled paring slick w/ off set handle, modern turned walnut handle, G. The slicks maker "A. Fisher" is attributed to be Adam Fisher working by 1788, in Manor Twp. A second strike at re-edging is "G. Sener" is attributed to Gottlieb Sener, circa 1843, Lancaster City.
525. "J. Shonk" upper-bit posthole mortise axe w/ single lug & chamfer worked edges, Vg. Attributed to John Shonk that worked later part of 19th century in Mt. Joy & Mastersonville, Lancaster Co. Pa.
526. "W. Addams" right-hand "Goosewing" axe w/ 13 1/2" edge, chamfered top tapered off-set socket, tapered butt plate, & wide arched-top key. Attributed to William Addams a descendant of founders of Adamstown, Pa., who later moved to Brecknock Twp., Berks Co. The embossed strike has 4 – small floret strikes that surround makers mark. (typical Berks Co. tradition)
527. "Steinman & Co." rare, Pennsylvania rounded heel "Slipper-type" side broad axe w/ rear third mount, chamfer-top tapered off-set socket. The socket has narrow upper-bit mount to 13 1/8" edged blade that terminates w/ flat toe. The strike is for Steinman Hardware Store, of Lancaster City. The store was founded by John Frederick Steinman in 1744. It stayed in operation until 1960. Maker is probably a Lancaster City maker.
528. 2 – Wrought iron socket handle fish/animal gigs, unsigned: 6-prong gig w/ barbed prongs on round rod stem, G+; 5-flat prong gig w/ square stock stem, F. (early noted repair). Note these both have long handles, all internet bidders should plan on picking up personally.
529. *Fantastic embellished Eagle strike : "I. Ressler" 3" socket handle slick w/ fantastic floret strike surrounded deep-set Federal Eagle strike. The strike has finely detailed shielded breast eagle perched on limb w/ outstretched wings. Attributed to Isaac Ressler, working 1850, Warwick Twp., Lancaster Co. A fine piece for any tool collection. The walnut handle is a 20th century fine turned replacement.
530. "D. Palm" center-bit posthole axe, Vg. Axe is attributed to Daniel Palm, who worked in Brecknock Twp., Lancaster Co.
531. 2 – Signed, Lancaster Co., reaping sickles. Both are by Long family of Drumore Twp., Lancaster Co.: 1st "H. Long" is attributed to Henry Long that was record as working prior to 1790; 2nd "I. Long" is attributed to John Long that was recorded as working prior to 1759 in Drumore Twp.
532. "C.W.T & S.C." Continental-type 1 7/8" chisel axe w/ chamfer-top shielded socket, chamfer edged chisel-face, 15 1/2" depth from edge to socket & two upper chip deflectors, G+. The tool has small chip from corner of edge
533. 2 – Continental-type hatchet/axes: "P.J.S., Pavia" (Italian) trade axe/tomahawk w/ round eye. The tomahawk also has initials "F.A.", G; early, combination maul/hatchet w/ wide 3 1/2" socket. Hatchet shows extensive used w/ pounding to butt-plate, F-G
534. Fine, "W. Beatty, Chester, Pa." (Steer strike) side broad axe w/ modern carved off-set handle. The axe retains partial original gold-leaf paint, VG
535. "R.A. Berry, Cast Steel" Yankee-pattern side broad axe w/ 8 1/2" edge, extended poll, & dbl.-lugged socket, Vg. The axe has early carving off-set handle. Attributed to Robert A. Berry working 1849, New Milford, NJ.

536. 2 – Continental-type side axes, G.: “D” cooper’s bench axe w/ slight curved blade, flat-back tapered eye. The axe has short carved off-set handle w/ octagon end; “U.K.” or “U.R.” “Gaul-wing” side hatchet w/ flat-surface butt-strike. The carved off-set handle has bug-hole damage
537. “Joseph Breck & Son, Boston, Mass” tobacco axe (?) w/ edged upper face & rounded heel without edge. The mark is for a seed & agriculture retailer company that was founded 1822. The axe has simple form wrapped-fold socket, G
538. Signed (??) massive Wheelwright’s hooked-tip hub reamer. The reamer is up to 5 1/2” diameter & is over 35” long. *Note to internet bidders- This piece is extremely heavy, and will be very expensive to ship. No returns, because you do not want to pay shipping fee!
539. Signed (??) Hungarian-type bearded axe w/ 10 1/4” edge, oak handle, G-G+
540. “H. Stahler” Wheelwright’s small wheel hub reamer w/ hook tip. The radius is from 1”-3 1/2” Dia. X 35 1/2” L. Attributed to Henry Stahler who is believed to work near Allentown, Pa.
541. *Restorer lot: Signed (??), 18th century tool decorated bearded right-hand side broad hatchet. Continental-type, but possible colonial period broad hewing hatchet w/ extensive tool decorations and massive “Cob-web” on broadest portion of blade. F-G
542. “I. German” ex-Gruber Wagon Works in Berks Co., massive wheelwright’s hooked-tip reamer. 2”-5 1/2” dia. X 31” overall length. The reamer has yellow crayon marked attribution that is similar to notes from Beitler collection. The maker is possibly Jacob Garman, an early 18th smith that worked in Lancaster Boro., G
543. Fine, Stanley #55 combination molding plane w/ original slide-over box. The plane looks mostly complete w/ multi-row rack of blades, fences, guides, etc. Vg
544. 5 – Wooden joinery planes, G-Vg: Sandusky Tool, two-way T&G; 2 – tongue molding planes: H. Wells, Williamsburg, Mass.; A. Hammacher & Co., Bowery, NY.; Sandusky drop-fence T&G; Andruss, Newark, NJ. grooving plane; Barton, rabbet plane
545. 4 – Wooden molding planes, G+-Vg: Sargent & Co. #6-1 1/4” dbl.-blade nosing plane; Livingston & Co. dado; J.T. Platt, dado; Cherry homecrafted dovetail plane
546. 4 – Wooden dado molding planes, G+-Vg: Way & Sherman, New York; J. Colton, Phila.; Owasco Tool Co.; unsigned
547. 12 – Assorted wooden hollow/round simple molding planes, F-Vg. Makers include: Andruss; Jos. Slater; H. Chapin; Thos. Appleton; etc.
548. 17 – Assorted wooden hollow/round simple molding planes, various makers & sizes, F-G
549. Stanley #45 combination molding plane w/ plastic box of assorted blades, G+-Vg. The plane has long rails, fence & skate
550. 8 – Assorted socket mortise chisels, various sizes & makers, G-Vg

571. 2 – Edge tools, F-G: "Dunlop & Madeira" (weak strike) upper-bit posthole mortise axe. Dunlop & Madeira was a Chambersburg maker in 1830; earlier, hammer-poll belt hatchet/tomahawk
572. Multi-struck "A.F.G." French-type long blade socket handle felling axe w/ 7" long round socket, F-G
573. Relic, 17th or 18th century pick-axe or twibil w/ lg. octagon hub & round eye. Tool has modern handle, but has deep relic pitting, 26 1/2" length across head
574. Relic, Spanish-type trade axe "tomahawk" w/ round socket, modern handle, deep relic surface pitting to iron

VG	Very Good condition	Small cracks in wooden parts, no repairs. Has minor loss to original finish or fully refinished & restored. Ideal for collector's or display purpose.
G	Good condition	Minor cracks in wood parts, repairs may be needed for use, has substantial paint or finish loss. Minor rust damage on iron planes & tools. Ideal for users or those wishing to refurbish for collection.
F	Fair condition	Substantial cracks to wooden or metal parts. Most parts still intact, but may have had substantial damage. Major rust damage. Needs attention or repair prior to use. Good for parts.

Cataloguer's note: This list is a guide that contains our description of each piece. We used several tool references, guides and years of experience handling these tools to create these descriptions. However, many pieces are hand wrought for a particular purpose and no reference to their use exists.

“Rarity” is a very difficult attribute to determine, but we considered how often these pieces have come across our auction block in the past several years to make that distinction. This may not always be in agreement with all price or collector guides.

The conditional reference was done in a fashion that we felt described the quality or condition of each piece. Please refer to the chart above.
