45. 2 – Hand planes: unknown maker (Stanley-type) #49 flip-bottom T&G plane. The plane is totally unmarked, Vg; Stanley #194 Fiber Board beveling plane, NIB
46. Early model, Stanley #45 combination molding plane w/ floral embossed casting, rack of blades, Vg.
47. Rare, “I Carpenter, Reading, Pa.” patent improved transitional bench jointer plane, G-VG. The plane was patented Aug. 25, 1868, by Israel Carpenter & Frederick Smith. Israel Carpenter (1824-1890) was a nephew of “E.W. Carpenter, Lancaster”. He was an ordained minister from 1852-1879, and sustained his ministry working as a carpenter/woodworker. Frederick Smith was a brother-in-law of Israel Carpenter, and was a “Hatter” by trade. The plane has a wooden sole with decorative cast frame top and iron screw cap w/ wooden wedge shaped blade holder. (Some casting cracks noted to decorative elements). Provenance ex-Bud Brown collection & used by Roger Smith in Vol. 1 Patented Transitional & Metallic Planes

48. Rare, "F. Baringer" (attributed to Southeastern Pa.) 4 5/8" wide panel badger plane w/ skew set iron & 21 3/4" overall length. G-Vg (repair handle)
49. Rare strike, "Brady, Lancaster, Pa." right-hand side broad axe w/ dbl.-lug & carved hickory off-set handle, Vg. Attributed to William Brady & Son, who crafted tool in both Mt. Joy, & Lancaster City, Pa.
50. Rare strike, "G. Sener, Extra Fine" w/ Federal era "Shielded Eagle" upper-bit posthole axe, G. The axe has a secondary re-edging strike by "G. Sener". Attributed to Gotlieb Sener/Sehner, 1830-1840, Lancaster City, Pa.
51. Rare form, "I. Snyder" T-handled auger, G+. Attributed to John Snyder working 1820's in Mt. Joy, Pa,
52. Fine, "H.J. Jackson, Ebor Works, Sheffield" rosewood & brass "Metallic Frame Brace", Vg. The Ultimatum-type brace has fine rosewood infill & turned knurl. The brace is owner marked by "H. Young", G+-Vg
53. Early, wrought iron "Lantern-top" brace w/ 7 – early brace bits, G-G+
54. "G.C. Eberly" (??), rare form wrought iron "stone-cutter's" axe. G. The iron handled stone cutting axe has 12 - socket & wedge held chisel picks. Maker is unknown.
55. Rare, "J.P. Brady" patented "Eagle millstone pick #2, F-G. The millstone pick was made by William Brady, Mt. Joy, Pa. The pick was patented Aug. 17, 1858, by Jacob P. Brady of Mt. Joy, Pa. The pick head sockets have some cracks from use, but copies of patent papers are included.
56. 2 – "W. Brady" (William Brady, worked in both Mt. Joy, Pa. & Lancaster City, Pa.) stone working hammers, G-Vg; millstone pick w/ 9 – replaceable chisel-picks. The pick is designed socket shaped w/ threaded bolts to hold replaceable picks; Brush hammer for working (smoothing) the face of a stone
57. "W. Addams" (attributed to William Adams, descendant of founder of Adamstown, Pa. later Berks Co.) left-hand side broad axe w/ carved hickory off-set handle, G+-Vg. The embossed strike is surrounded w/ 4 sunburst strikes,
58. Very rare form, "J. Stamm, Mount Joy, Lan. Co., Pa." lumberman's board foot rule, Vg. The 24" long 1 1/4" x 1 1/4" stock rule has fine turned handle. Each side of square stock rule has 4-tiers of calibration, and the stick has mounted iron stock foot.
59. Assembled pair, "D. Colton, Phila." w/ arch, stars & tools strike "stair rail or meeting rail" wooden molding planes. The planes lengths are 9 5/8" & 8" long. Each plane has similar ogee molding configuration & moving sole mount. One is for left cut & other for right cut, Vg
60. 3 – Signed, brass faced wood handled squares, G-Vg: "J. Begbie, Phila." 4" try square (mahogany grip); "W. Cresson, Phila." 3" try square, mahogany grip; "W. Cresson, Phila." 3" mitre square
61. "Topp's Framing Tool" 10" combination bevel-square w/ calibrated rafter cuts chart on blade, G-Vg
62. Boxed, Currier-Koeth Mfg., Co., Coudersport, Pa. "Koeth's Kombination Kit" multi-tool kit w/ pliers grip & 6 – interchangeable heads in oak hinged-lid case, F.-G
63. 3 – Various small size sliding-T bevels, G-Vg: unsigned rosewood & brass handle w/ 6" ruled edge blade; unsigned, 3" w/ mahogany grip, G; "Stanley Rule & Level" 4" combination square-bevel (drilled holes in handle)
64. 2 – Squares: Cresson, Phila. 10" combination try square/level w/ mahogany & brass handle,, G+; Bench-crafted rosewood triangle square w/ "mother of pearl" buttons, G-Vg (small hairline crack noted)
65. "E.W. Carpenter, Lancaster" 24" wooden panel slitting gauge w/ fine "Lancaster Shop" boxwood threaded stop screw, Vg (small noted chip from fence edge)

67. 2 – Measuring devices: "C. Scholl, Pat. 3-8-1864" mahogany & brass triple-arm marking gauge w/ boxwood stop screw, G+-Vg. The uncommon marking gauge has 6 – brass buttons on face of fence, each slide-arm is brass tipped & 1 – arm has brass slide-mortise gauge; matched pr. brass/steel-tipped panel marking gauges. Each brass housing has heart motif, G
68. Fine, "Union Factory, H. Chapin" #240, boxwood handled screw-arm plow plane, G+-Vg. (note a early wood dry-in hairline crack is noted along upper edge of plane
69. Fine, "Union Factory, H. Chapin" #239, cherry & boxwood handled screw-arm plow plane, G+-Vg
70. 2 – Pennsylvania, wooden molding planes: Rare, "A. Kemper" (found near Millbach, Lebanon Co.) 13 1/2" long handled panel/field raising badger plane w/ chamfer molded shoulder, movable sole mounted fence removed. Plane has dovetail inset hardwood biscuits; "I. Schauer" (John Schauer, East Petersburg, Pa.) moving fillister plane w/ hardwood inlaid edge biscuits & moving sole mounted fence, G+ (weak strike)

71. 2 – Cooper’s tools: “H.H. Mellinger” (attributed to Henry H. Mellinger, mid-late 19th century, Washington Boro, Lancaster Co.) tight radius adze w/ round eye, G-G+; unsigned, wrought iron 6 1/4” dia. wheel traveler w/ mushroom capped handle, G-G+. The wheel has 4-brace arms.
72. 4 – Various, wrought iron primitives: “W. Brady & Son” (Mt. Joy) tobacco spear; “Stauffer” (Barto area, Berks Co.) dengelstock; “W. Brady” (same as above) dengelstock; “Hister” (Eastern Pa.) dengelstock
73. 2 – Signed, hand wrought tool heads: Rare form, “I. Ressler” w/ Federal Eagle & florets strikes, wheelwright’s hook tipped hub router (missing secondary edge). Attributed to Isaac Ressler, working in 1860, in Warwick Twp., Lancaster Co.; “E.C. Stuck” (*??) 5-tine socket handled fish gig, G
74. 3 – Signed, socket handled firmer chisels, various types, G-Vg. Makers include: “G. Sener” (Gottlieb Sener, Lancaster City); “W. Brady” (William Brady, Mt. Joy or Lancaster City)
75. 2 – Wooden wedge arm molding planes, F+-G: “Jacob Heiss” (working in Lancaster, Pa. by 1807) plow plane w/ iron stop screw on depth gauge (has later era replaced fence); “Weber” (weak strike) chamfer plane. Attributed to Lancaster Co.
76. 2 – Wooden screw arm planes, “D. Kuns” (Lehigh Co.??) plow plane w/ fruitwood threads, stops & knobs; “Israel White, Phila.” sash fillister plane, G.
77. 3 – Various tools: “Brady, Lancaster, PA.” dbl.-edge millstone pick, G+; unsigned, 20oz. triple-claw hammer, F. Traditional round claw w/ each claw having a small caw tip; unknown maker, 16oz. dbl.-claw hammer w/ small interior claw designed for use in set/start nail, G
78. 2 – Backsaws w/ brass split-nuts, G-Vg: rare strike, “Henry Disston & Son, Phila.”, 12” brass back w/ low profile “worm” strike; “Henry Disston” 10” steel back w/ type 3, arch strike w/ 2 – Federal Eagles
79. 2 – Early, “fishtail handled compass/case handsaws: “Johnson & Conaway, Phila.” 14”, refinished G+; “Browne” 16”, G+
80. 2 – Various backsaws: “Johnson & Conaway, Phila.” 12” brass back mitre saw w/ brass split-nuts, repaired fruitwood handle; “Henry Disston & Sons” 12” steel “halfback” w/ non-traditional shaped grip, G-G+

Cataloguer's note: This list is a guide that contains our description of each piece. We used several tool references, guides and years of experience handling these tools to create these descriptions. However, many pieces are hand wrought for a particular purpose and no reference to their use exists.

“Rarity” is a very difficult to attribute or determine, but we considered how often these pieces have come across our auction block in the past several years to make that distinction. This may not always be in agreement with all price or collector guides.

The conditional reference was done in a fashion that we felt described the quality or condition of each piece. Please refer to the chart above.

Absentee bids: We strongly recommend that anyone wishing to place an absentee bid *examine the item in person first*. If you choose to place an absentee bid based on the description in the catalog alone, without examining the item personally, you do so at your own risk.
